

The Ford Motor company wasn't kidding when they said they have created the most powerful Mustang ever built.

The New Ford 2020 Ford Mustang Shelby GT 500's supercharged 5.2L V8 makes 760 horse power and 625 lbs. of torque.

This makes the GT500 more powerful than the top 650-hp Chevy Camaro ZLI, Ford had originally stated "700-plus hp" for this new top-dog Mustang, but it's clear now that that claim was conservative


