




Solitary Works

Well here it is the end of May and already it is summer (Getting HOT). Well where do I start? Let's back up about 3 weeks and start there. While working on my project truck and getting the bed back on to see what the complete project look like one of my Friends from Auston Texas shows up to visit. He saw the truck when it was in pieces and was now checking it out. The UPS man showed up also and he has been following the build of the truck from the get/go. They wanted to see how the motor came out and hear it run so I reach in the cab to pop the hood and guess what? The release cable came loose or broke! The hood didn't open (NOT GOOD). If that cable doesn't release the latch under the hood it just doesn't open (well #!@T). U-Tube is no help because other people have had this issue and nobody has any good answers other than your screwed and there is no just one fix. They say to take the grill out (you still can't reach it) but you have to have the hood open to get to 5 each 7mm bolts that go into the top of it. I thought maybe if I took off the inner fender, I could get to the release then but no good either. I could get to the hood hinges and maybe unbolt them and lift the hood from the back side but that take two people (and the hood is still latch) and I'm only one right now. So, after looking at a drawing of the catch and using a tool I got from "Porter's Cleaner" (coat hanger) and working for the most part blind on where I was going on this, I started. The whole time I doing this I thinking this Sucks. The truck is put together and I can't even open the hood! Bad things going through my brain from a BIG Hammer and Crow Bar to taking a 2" hole saw and going through my new hood to get to the release latch. After about 30min and a lot of Happy Thoughts the hood open. Looking at what had happened the cable just came off because "I DIDN'T BEND A VERY SMALL TAB FAR ENOUGH"

to hold the cable in place. After placing the cable back on it and bending the small tab, then robing the bread box (those little small ties) (then a ty-rap) and then some hot glue on it I don't think it's coming lose anytime soon. Now it's time to close the hood! (I worked the release many times to make sure it worked) and hope for the best. Well it now works like a storebought TIMEX and this NIGHTMARE has been taken care of. The key here is to check twice so it will open & close many times .

2021 Ford Mustang Mach 1 brings back the historic badge



When rumors swirled that Ford would revive the hallowed Mach 1 moniker on an electric vehicle, you could feel the fanboy resentment through the series of tubes that comprises the internet. Then the Mach E came out, nobody had a problem with the name and we all moved on with life. But now, the Mach 1 is officially coming back in a way that probably will not irk anyone. Ford confirmed that it will revive the Mustang Mach 1 trim. The Mach 1 will serve as a bridge between the naturally-aspirated V8 Mustangs of the world and the higher-performance insanity that Shelby-branded 'Stangs bring to the table. Ford calls it "the most track-ready 5.0-liter Mustang ever," which is an expectation lofty enough to earn a NASA mission patch, but one that Ford can deliver on. Beyond that chest-beating, Ford hasn't offered up much in the way of Mach 1 information. It did, however, include some teaser images with the announcement. The camouflaged prototypes in these teasers look properly beefy, with honkin' circular intakes on either side of the grille, in addition to some more front-end tweaks we're not yet privy to. Out back, we have four big tailpipes below a wing that's surprisingly modest for a car that will likely pack quite a punch. The Brembo brakes hiding behind the Mach 1's wheels pretty much fill the wells, and its rollers are wrapped in properly stuck Michelin Pilot Sport Cup 2 performance tires. Currently, the gap between GT and GT350 is occupied with the Bullitt, a specialedition Mustang that throws it back to the Steve McQueen days while throwing a bit more capability into the mix than the average GT. It's unclear if the Mach 1 will replace the Bullitt or live alongside it, but with its debut in the not-toodistant future, we won't have to wait long to find out.
