They also had a board at the front of the room that showed numbers that were called, plus a diagram example that would light up to indicate different patterns that you had to get a bingo in. Each game had a different pattern to get a bingo, and some numbers were also free.

It is an exciting game, but can be trying at times trying to keep up with 9 cards for each game. With that said, all had a good time, and we will be planning another bingo trip again.


