## Spring vehicle maintenance checklist: be prepared!

- 1. Inspect your windshield wipers. The chilly temperatures of winter can cause the rubber blades to lose their effectiveness. If you need new blades, you might opt for blades optimized for summer conditions.
- 2. Check the condition and level of your oil. If it's been over 3,000 miles since your last oil change, it's probably best just to do an oil and lube. The searing heat caused by summer driving is unkind to motor oils. If you live in a mild climate or will be towing a trailer, a higher viscosity oil might be necessary.
- 3. Evaluate your battery. Did you know that summer can actually be tougher on your battery than winter?
- 4. See if your engine needs more coolant, and check its condition, too. You may need to add coolant or have a flush-and-fill performed. Trying to make it through summer with inadequate coolant is a recipe for a vehicle breakdown.
- 5. Speaking of keeping cool, test your air conditioning system. If it's not providing enough cool air, you may need more refrigerant. Or, you might have a clogged condenser, leak, or loose drive belt. Regard-less, it's smart to fix this situation in spring before the peak heat of summer arrives.
- 6. Check your tire pressure. Wide temperature variations are common with changes of season and can cause your tires to lose pressure more quickly. Under-inflated tires don't perform as well as properly inflated tires. Also, be sure to rotate your tires according to the manufacturer's recommendations.
- Monitor the tread on your tires. If they look worn, replace your tires before the heavy rains and reduced traction of summer comes along. Don't forget to check your spare tire too (unless you have a Shelby.) A flat or dry-rotted spare is just dead weight.
- 8. Winter conditions and salt on the roads can lead to corrosion of brake parts; Anti-lock braking systems get an especially hard workout in winter's slick conditions. Nothing is more crucial to your safety than your brakes, so get them checked. Trouble signs: pulling to one side when you hit the brakes, squeaking or grinding noises and a brake pedal that feels too soft.
- 9. Determine if you need to replace any belts or hoses. Look for cracks, swelling, fraying or leakage. If something looks borderline, you should replace the belt or hose because summer's heat and humidity will likely cause it to fail.
- 10. Check the shocks or struts for signs of physical damage, such as leaking, rusting, or dents. Also be aware of the warning signs that you may need them replaced: vehicle rolls or sways on turns, front end dives when braking, rear end squats when accelerating, vehicle sits lower in the front or rear, a loss of directional control during sudden stops, and the vehicle bounces or slides sideways on a wind-ing and rough road.

Don't be this guy. Changing your wiper blades regularly is a lot easier than using a squeegee!
